OC COMMUNITY RESOURCES

Orange County Parks Commission Duties and Responsibilities

(O.C. Codified Ordinances Sec. 2-2-19: Paraphrased)

Except as otherwise provided, the Orange County Parks Commission shall be advisory to the Board of Supervisors and to the Director of OC Parks, and shall have the power and duty:

- 1. To recommend to the Board of Supervisors plans and policies for the acquisition, development, maintenance and operation of the harbors, beaches and regional parks of the County;
- 2. On request of the Board of Supervisors, to advise the Board and make recommendations on any matter pertaining to harbors, beaches and regional parks, and any other matters referred by the Board;
- 3. On request of the Director, to advise on any question of administrative policy and regarding any matter to be decided by the Director under this division;
- 4. On appeal from an administrative decision by the Director, to act as a board of administrative review;
- 5. To make such investigations as it may deem necessary in the exercise of its powers;
- 6. To perform the duties and functions of the County Fish and Game Commission assigned by either statute or this code, and consider methods for the propagation and protection of fish and game in the State of California and County of Orange. The Commission shall be advisory body to the Board of Supervisors.

<u>Wilderness Access Day: Limestone Canyon – Irvine Ranch Open Space – Saturday, October 7 – 8 a.m. – 2 p.m.</u>

 Start your weekend off by exploring numerous opportunities found throughout magnificent Limestone Canyon. Designated trails will be open for self-guided trail use in OC Parks' Irvine Ranch Open Space. Trail routes vary in distance and level of difficulty with choices ranging from easy one-hour walks to strenuous 15-mile cardio treks. Whether traveling by feet or wheels, Wilderness Access Day in Limestone Canyon is a treasure waiting to be discovered by hikers and mountain bikers alike.

<u>Modjeska Birthday Celebration – Arden: Helena Modjeska Historic House</u> and Gardens – Saturday, October 7 – 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.

• Come celebrate Helena Modjeska's birthday at her historic home of Arden! One of the most famous Shakespearean actresses of the late Victorian era, Modjeska's home designed in 1888 by renowned New York architect Stanford White is one of two National Historic Landmarks in Orange County. Enjoy Shakespearean performances by the Modjeska Shakespeare Players throughout the day as well as live music performances. You can also tour the house and explore the grounds as OC Parks' volunteer docents will be available to share stories and answer questions about the property. You can even taste one of the famous caramel and marshmallow Modjeska candies!

Walk Through Irvine Park's History – Wednesday, October 11 – 9 – 11 a.m.

Take a closer look into California's first county park and discover the
fascinating details that make Irvine Regional Park unique to Orange
County. We will explore more than 125 years of the park's history,
including its rich native flora and fauna, Early Inhabitants,
architectural design, military use, ranching days, and discuss the
future of Irvine Regional Park.

<u>Boo at the Oaks – Santiago Oaks Regional Park – Friday, October 13 – 5:30 – 9:30 p.m.</u>

 The night is full of creepy creatures and scary sounds...unless you know what's out there! Visit Santiago Oaks Regional Park after dark to discover critters that call this canyon home. The evening is filled with fun nature stations, creative crafts, scavenger hunts for prizes and night hikes!

<u>Fall-O-Ween – Heritage Hill Historic Park – October 13–15 – 4:30 – 8:30 p.m.</u>

 Join OC Parks at Heritage Hill Historical Park this fall for the third annual Fall-O-Ween! Tour the decorated historical grounds during special park hours and take your picture at a variety of fall and Halloween-themed photo opportunities. Try to find your way through the straw maze and complete a scavenger hunt for ghoulish goodies at this family-friendly event.

Prehistoric OC at Clark Park –Saturday, October 14 – 10 a.m. – 2 p.m.

 Join OC Parks for Prehistoric OC, a free event inviting families to explore the natural and cultural history of Orange County. Enjoy fun and educational activities presented by OC Parks archaeologists and paleontologists along with exhibitors from local cultural, paleontological and geological organizations. Families can enjoy free educational entertainment with hands-on activities, programs and demonstrations.

Annual Solar Eclipse Viewing Party – Caspers Wilderness Park – Saturday, October 14 – 8 – 10 a.m.

 Join us at the Caspers Wilderness Park Nature Center to view an annular solar eclipse where the moon will cover almost 80% of the sun's visible surface. Eclipses happen fairly regularly, but this will be the most coverage of the solar surface visible in Orange County until 2045! Bring lawn chairs, blankets and anything else you might need to enjoy the show.

<u>Living Historian at Civil War Cannon – Irvine Regional Park – Sunday, October 15 – 11:30 a.m. – 3 p.m.</u>

 Come chat with a Civil War living historian at the cannon in Irvine Regional Park! The volunteer will share the history of the 1853 Howitzer cannon and how it came to be at its current location. Hear recounts of other historical elements found in and around Irvine Regional Park's long history as well as the Civil War. You can find

the Civil War living historian located at the cannon and Spanish-American War Veterans monument at the lake, near the snack stand and boat house, between parking lots U and T.

Bird Walk in Santiago Oaks – Wednesday, October 18 – 7:30 – 9:30 a.m.

• Stroll through the park searching high and low for our flittering friends. Listen for their sweet song and hear fun associations to help you remember these birds. This program is geared for all levels, though focused for beginner-intermediate level birders.

Restorative Bird Watching – Arden: Helena Modjeska Historic House and Gardens – Friday, October 20 – 8 – 10 a.m.

 Some studies have shown bird watching can have a positive impact on mental health and state of mind. Join OC Parks on the grounds of Arden: Helena Modjeska Historic House and Gardens for this slow-paced and accessible bird walk that will encourage bird watching practices designed to emphasize these benefits by connecting with nature, guided observation, building community, sharing stories, encouraging creativity and practicing mindfulness.
