

Capistrano County Beach Shoreline Project

Project Summary

Replace existing 240 feet of geotextile bags with rock at Capistrano Beach within the City of Dana Point. This temporary measure is a joint project between OC Parks and OC Public Works. Public access and parking may be limited during construction.



WHAT

- Removal of existing geotextile sandbags. Sand used in the geotextile sandbags will be deposited onto beach area.
- Construction of riprap in the central section adjacent to the parking area.



PARTIAL PARKING LOT CLOSURE

A portion of parking spaces will be closed.



DETOURS AND SAFETY

Flaggers will direct pedestrians and bicyclists to avoid work area. Watch for additional traffic control measures including construction signage.



BACKGROUND

Sand-filled geotextile bags were initially approved by the California Coastal Commission (CCC) as a temporary solution to protect the seaward edge of the park. The CCC requires removal of all sand cubes/sandbags and has approved replacement using rock, which will also remain as a temporary measure while more permanent initiatives continue to be further developed.
